Winter Survival: Caribou



In this lesson, students will explore how caribou survive the harsh winter months by migrating to warmer regions to locate food sources and protect their young.

Essential Question(s)	How do caribou adapt to survive the challenges of winter? What role does migration play in the survival of caribou during the winter season?

Learning Objective(s)	Students will be able to understand the various survival strategies of caribou during winter, including migration, food sources, and protection of offspring.			
Materials/Resources	Winter Survival: Caribou Level 1 Winter Survival: Caribou Level 2 Caribou Cloze Maze Reading Activity			
Vocabulary	Herbivore: animal that only eats plants and not meat; predators: animals that hunt other animals for food; habitat: home; area where animals live; routes: paths			
Anticipatory Set	Begin by playing the short video clip accompanying the article. Ask students if they've ever heard of caribou or perhaps they're more familiar with the term reindeer. Display the images and maps from the Slide Show and discuss where in the world caribou are located.			
Guided Instruction	 Pre Teach vocabulary words prior to reading the article Read the first four paragraphs of the article aloud. Ask students what problems do some animals have in winter? (not enough food; too cold) Then ask students how do caribou survive in the winter? (They migrate south to warmer areas.) Ask students to think of another reason why caribou migrate in the winter. Invite them to continue reading the article with a partner in order to locate the answer. (protect their young) 			
Independent Activity	After students finish reading the article, have them complete the student activity sheet (Caribou Cloze Maze Reading Activity). Students should read the passage and fill in the missing words using a word from the word bank.			
Closure/Assessment	Review key points about how and why some animals, such as caribou, survive in the winter. (migration and to find food and protect their young) After reviewing, have students complete the quiz questions found in the article's engagement toolbar.			
Differentiation	Adjust lexile levels as needed; use accessibility tools and Read-to-Me feature as needed; print copies of article
